

Hysterosalpingogram

Hysterosalpingogram or HSG is performed to evaluate whether the fallopian tubes are open or blocked. The procedure is performed in the radiology suite. Your doctor will place a catheter in the uterus and expand the uterine cavity with liquid that can be seen on X-ray. A technician will enter the room and take pictures as an attempt is made to push liquid through the tubes.

Risk includes pain, infection, bleeding and uterine perforation.

Please note that some injuries and complications are not recognizable at the time of surgery or may develop in the hours or days following your surgery.

Although precautions will be taken to protect your safety, no procedure is without risk.
